<u>Mission & Education</u>: Marc Edge shared that the harvest party had good attendance and was a success. New acolytes have been trained and are now in place. During last Wednesday night's gathering, church members had the chance to assemble shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child. The children's choir is scheduled to perform on November 19th and December 10th. Currently, donations for White Christmas, dedicated to loved ones in honor or memory, are being accepted. The White Christmas tree will be housed in the PAC building this year. On November 29th, there will be an opportunity to create new Chrismon ornaments, and on December 6th, church members will sing Christmas carols for those who are homebound.

Finance Report: Howell Clark reported:

General Fund Balance as of October 31, 2023: \$321,720.05 Special Funds Balance as of October 31,2023: \$289,017.97 Total Offering Received for October 2023: \$26,749.74 Total Budget Expenses for October 2023: \$21,080.87 Net Income for October 2023: \$5,668.87

Worship: Hayes Petteway reported Marc Edge is the head usher for November. The church needs head ushers for December. The church will hold communion on November 26<sup>th</sup>. The Christmas Eve service will be in the morning only.

Operations: Chris Campbell provided an update that the generator has been repaired.

Endowment Committee: Hayes Petteway reported the endowment fund balances as of September 2023: Scholarship fund: \$978,302; Family fund: \$222,250; Regular fund: \$642,136

<u>Congregational Care</u>- Willie Kay McDuffie shared the latest news regarding individuals on the prayer list and emphasized the importance of continuing to keep everyone in our thoughts and prayers. The committee is considering doing something for patients in the nursing home and is also exploring the possibility of creating fruit baskets for those who are homebound.

<u>Personnel Committee</u>: Elizabeth Cole stated that Pastor Dayton held a staff meeting. The session discussed several items.

<u>Pastor Report:</u> Pastor Dayton addressed the session, emphasizing the role of spiritual leadership within the church. Reading from Romans Chapter 12, he shared insights on viewing ourselves as more than just workers. The session discussed the topic, offering various responses and examples of ways we can lead.
